Publicity of project summary of Specific Actions	Based on our understanding of what is written about publicity in the CPR and the fact that we have been asked to provide a short project summary in the Specific actions applications we have submitted so far, we expect that information on which MS/SAC that receive funding from a certain Specific action call and what the funding should be used for, will be publicly available on the Commission's homepage after the call has been finalized. If this is correct – where can we find such information about past calls? Or are the publicity requirements limited to the MS/SAC publicly available websites?	So far, we have not published the project summaries on the website of the Commission, but we may do so in the future on the <a href="#">open data platform</a> . The publicity requirements apply to the MS and the SACs available websites. The results of past calls have been so far circulated to the Home Affairs Funds Committee.
